

THE PUBLIC THEATER ANNOUNCES JOSEPHINE AND I BY CUSH JUMBO ADDED TO SPRING LINE-UP

New York Premiere Directed by Phyllida Lloyd

December 1, 2014 – The Public Theater (Artistic Director, Oskar Eustis; Executive Director, Patrick Willingham) announced today that *JOSEPHINE AND I*, the London hit by Olivier nominated actress and writer **Cush Jumbo**, has been added to The Public's downtown spring season. Directed by **Phyllida Lloyd**, the New York premiere of *JOSEPHINE AND I* will begin performances at Joe's Pub at The Public on Friday, February 27 and run through Sunday, April 5, with an official press opening on Tuesday, March 10.

"We know Cush Jumbo is an astonishing actress; now we get to see her in a whole new light," said **Artistic Director Oskar Eustis**. "Phyllida Lloyd is one of our bravest and most brilliant directors, and I'm proud to be presenting her long awaited Public debut."

Following a critically acclaimed run at London's Bush Theatre, **Cush Jumbo** (*The River, Julius Caesar,* "Getting On") brings her one-woman show to The Public. Born into poverty in the slums of St. Louis, Josephine Baker became one of the most famous and groundbreaking stars of the 20th century. The first African-American performer to rise to international prominence, she was a French Resistance spy and civil rights activist who was married twice by age 16 and served as muse to Pablo Picasso, F. Scott Fitzgerald and Ernest Hemingway, who called her "the most sensational woman anyone ever saw." Now, nearly 40 years after her death, Baker's life inspires a young woman to face up to the sacrifices required to follow one's dreams. A performance featuring swinging jazz and ragtime rhythms, this theatrical event directed by Tony nominee **Phyllida Lloyd** (*Julius Caesar, Mary Stuart, The Iron Lady, Mama Mia!*) interweaves a modern day story of an ambitious young woman with the fascinating life of the peerless, fearless, Josephine Baker.

Her London theatre credits include Henry IV (Donmar Warehouse); Julius Caesar (Donmar Warehouse and St Ann's Warehouse, NY); Mary Stuart (Donmar Warehouse, Apollo, and Broadway); The Threepenny Opera; Boston Marriage (Donmar Warehouse); Josephine and I (Bush Theatre); Six Degrees of Separation; Hysteria; Wild East (Royal Court); The Rime of the Ancient Mariner (Old Vic Tunnels); The Way of the World; Pericles; What the Butler Saw; The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie; The Duchess of Malfi (Royal National Theatre); Artists and Admirers; The Virtuoso (RSC); MAMMA MIA! CUSH JUMBO, currently appearing in *The River* on Broadway with Hugh Jackman, was presented with the "Emerging Talent Award" at this year's Evening Standard Awards for her self-penned solo show, *Josephine and I* (which originated at The Bush Theatre in July 2013). She was also nominated for "Outstanding Achievement in an Affiliate Theatre" at the Oliver Awards for her performance. That year Jumbo also reprised her role of Marc Antony in an all-female version of Shakespeare's *Julius Caesar* at St. Ann's Warehouse. The show originated at the Donmar Warehouse in London. For her performance, she was also nominated for an Olivier Award. Both productions were directed by acclaimed film and theatre director Phyllida Lloyd. Other theatre awards include "Best Actress" at The Manchester Awards for her performance as Nora in *A Doll's House* at the Royal Exchange Theatre Manchester and the prestigious "lan Charleson Award" for her performance as Rosalind in *As You Like It*, also at the Royal Exchange. Her television credits include the series lead in the top-rated "Vera" opposite Brenda Blethyn; the acclaimed comedy, "Getting On" (a U.S. version of the show now airs on HBO). Her film credits include the lead role in *Remainder* (based on the Tom K. McCarthy novel) and the hit feature *The Inbetweeners*.

Named for Public Theater founder Joe Papp, Joe's Pub at The Public opened in 1998 and plays a vital role in The Public's mission of supporting young artists while providing established artists with an intimate space to perform and develop new work. Joe's Pub consistently presents the best in live music and performance nightly, continuing its commitment to diversity, production values, community and artistic freedom. The organization also offers unique opportunities like *New York Voices*, an artist commissioning program that provides musicians the resources and tools needed to develop new original works. Commissioned artists have included Allen Toussaint, Ethan Lipton, Toshi Reagon, Bridget Everett, and more. In 2011, Joe's Pub received a top-to-bottom renovation, leading to improved sightlines, expanded seating capacity and a new menu from acclaimed Chef Andrew Carmellini.
