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Dear Friends,

1942 was the darkest year of the second World War. The United States had entered the war at the very end of 1941, when Japan bombed Pearl Harbor, but it was not yet clear what impact our military would have on the conflict. What was clear was the enormous strength of the Axis powers: the Nazi war machine seemed unstoppable, and Europe seemed almost certain to be entirely under Hitler's sway by the end of the year. It was a very hard year to be hopeful about the future of the world.

In that dark year, Thornton Wilder premiered *The Skin of Our Teeth* on Broadway. This loopy, deceptively chaotic, and surreal play argued that humanity had been on the brink of extinction many times before, and had always come through, even if only by the skin of our teeth. The message was welcome enough to make the show a hit, and to win it the Pulitzer Prize. **Ever since**, **the play has been beloved as it bedeviled: rarely has a play so acclaimed had a tone and style so hard to capture**.

Jeremy McCarter, dear friend of The Public and founder of our Public Forum program, bringing together great thinkers in conversation about wide-ranging topics, had the inspired idea over a decade ago that Ethan Lipton's music might be a perfect match for Wilder's play. He made the suggestion, Ethan responded, and for IO years we've been developing the project.

Jeremy McCarter has since left The Public, but remains close to us in many ways. In the years since his brainstorm about *Skin*, he has also become the literary executor of Thornton Wilder's estate, formalizing the trust we've always had in his judgment.

Now, finally, we get to bring this marvelous new adaptation to you. Shockingly, it feels like the perfect historical moment for THE SEAT OF OUR PANTS to have arrived.

Ethan Lipton has been part of The Public's artistic family in every way possible: part of the first class of the Emerging Writers Group, part of Joe's Pub New York Voices, frequent performer at the Pub, writer of and performer in two previous productions (*No Place to Go* and *The Outer Space*). His wry, intelligent, melancholic voice has turned out, as Jeremy predicted, to be a beautiful match to Wilder's literary voice.

Leigh Silverman has directed in every theater in this building in the 20 years I've been artistic director, and has triumphed over and over again. There's no one I trust more to handle both the scale and delicacy of this work. She's a brilliant director and a wonderful colleague and friend.

You are in for a wonderful treat. Hang on.

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THE PUBLIC continues the work of its visionary founder Joe Papp as a civic institution engaging, both on stage and off, with some of the most important ideas and social issues of today. Conceived over 60 years ago as one of the nation's first nonprofit theatres, The Public has long operated on the principles that theatre is an essential cultural force and that art and culture belong to everyone. Under the leadership of Artistic Director Oskar Eustis and Executive Director Patrick Willingham, The Public's wide breadth of programming includes an annual season of new work at its landmark home at Astor Place, Free Shakespeare in the Park at The Delacorte Theater in Central Park, the Mobile Unit touring throughout New York City's five boroughs, Public Lab, Public Works, Public Shakespeare Initiative and Joe's Pub. Since premiering Hair in 1967, The Public continues to create the canon of American theatre and is currently represented on Broadway by the Tony Awardwinning musicals Hamilton by Lin-Manuel Miranda and Hell's Kitchen by Alicia Keys and Kristoffer Diaz. Their programs and productions can also be seen regionally across the country and around the world. THORNTON WILDER (*Playwright*, The Skin of Our Teeth) (1897-1975) was a novelist and playwright whose work celebrates the connection between the commonplace and the cosmic dimensions of human experience. He is the only writer to win Pulitzer Prizes for both drama (Our Town and The Skin of Our Teeth) and fiction (The Bridge of San Luis Rey). He collaborated with Alfred Hitchcock on *Shadow of a Doubt*, hiked the Alps with the heavyweight boxing champion Gene Tunney, received a Bronze Star for his service in World War II and was credited with discovering Orson Welles. He was also a much-loved teacher, letter-writer (especially with Gertrude Stein) and public speaker—in four languages. Hello, Dolly! is based on his play *The Matchmaker*. 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FIRE COMMISSIONER



In 2011, Shanta Thake, who ran Joe's Pub, offered me a commission to write a musical. My band had been playing the Pub for a few years at that time. I also had a parallel relationship with The Public itself, having been in the first cohort of the Emerging Writers Group. Still, until Shanta asked, I had a policy about Songwriting and Playwriting: I kept them separate. To protect them from each other. Because they were bad. They were like bad little boys in the backseat of a car on a long drive to Bakersfield. And I was like, "Don't touch each other. Don't look at each other.

Don't even think about each other." **But on that day in Shanta's office, I discovered I had a story to tell through music**, and I saw that those boys in the backseat were in fact angels, and that I was a nut.

The following year, The Public produced *No Place to Go*, my band musical about a man whose job is outsourced to Mars, in Joe's Pub. **And the blockade I'd erected between Songwriting and Playwriting collapsed.** Since then, I've written more band musicals, a few plays with songs—I have one play that has three songs in it; how bad an idea is that?—and assorted permutations thereof. I keep looking for new ways the two forms can share space.

The Skin of Our Teeth opened on Broadway in 1942, and generations of theater-makers have found their own moment in its pages. When I began turning Wilder's play into a musical, I approached it with reverence. So much of it is perfectly itself, I wanted to preserve as much of that as possible. So there was a lot of genuflecting on my part, a lot of "Beg your pardon, Mr. Wilder," and "Can I fix you a drink, Mr. Wilder," this sort of thing. In time, I stopped being an acolyte. **The only way to do right by Wilder, I decided, was to be authorial.** To listen to the play with my own ears and fill it with the songs I heard. To handle the work and push it around. To prioritize what I found important and write the show I wanted to see.

The creative time I've spent inside of Wilder's world has been some of the most joyful of my life. It's been a long road but a great trip. And there have been moments when I'd look in the rearview mirror and see Songwriting sleeping on Playwriting's shoulder, and that was just the best. Then my mind would wander, and I'd hear a big SLAP coming from the backseat, and I'd be like, "Cut that shit out!" And on we'd go...
